

**DIGITALIZATION OF WOMEN'S MOVEMENT ARCHIVES**

- ◆ In digital form has been made available one of the most important periodicals for examining the history of the women's movement, "Woman's Struggle", of the League of Woman's Rights. The archival material covers the following periods of the magazine's circulation: 1923 – 1936, 1964 – 1967, 1979 – 1989, 1990 to the present.

*The archive is on the website and its contents can be accessed via a number of search criteria: date of issue, title, author, subject.*

- ◆ Cataloguing and classification of the around 1.500 books of the "Delfys" Women Archives and digitalization a part of the archive's visual material.
