Σκοπός του προγράμματος είναι η ειδίκευση εκπαιδευτικών και σχολικών ψυχολόγων σε θέματα διαμόρφωσης της ταυτότητας φύλου και προώθησης της ισότητας στο σχολείο.

Στο πλαίσιο του προγράμματος, που οδηγεί στη λήψη Μεταπτυχιακού Διπλώματος και στη συνέχεια Διδακτορικού, συνεργάζονται ο Τομέας Παιδαγωγικής του Τμήματος Φιλοσοφίας-Παιδαγωγικής και το Τμήμα Ψυχολογίας της Φιλοσοφικής Σχολής του Α.Π.Θ.

Στόχοι του προγράμματος είναι:

- να καταστήσει ειδικούς στη θεματική της ισότητας των φύλων άτομα που θα στελεχώσουν την εκπαίδευση (πτυχιούχους των Τμημάτων που προετοιμάζουν εκπαιδευτικούς και των Τμημάτων Ψυχολογίας) παρέχοντας τους τη δυνατότητα:
 - α) να μελετήσουν διεπιστημονικές θεωρητικές και ερευνητικές προσεγγίσεις των γυναικείων σπουδών με επικέντρωση στον εκπαιδευτικό χώρο,
 - β) να ασκηθούν στο σχεδιασμό, την υλοποίηση και την αξιολόγηση παρεμβατικών δράσεων στο πλαίσιο της εκπαιδευτικής διαδικασίας.
- να προετοιμάσει ένα ειδικά καταρτισμένο εκπαιδευτικό δυναμικό, το οποίο θα μπορεί να στηρίζει την εκπαιδευτική πολιτική για την ισότητα των φύλων, που ξεκίνησε με το σχεδιασμό του Β' ΕΠΕΑΕΚ.

- να δημιουργήσει νέο επιστημονικό δυναμικό, που θα στελεχώσει μελλοντικά τα Πανεπιστήμια και θα προωθήσει την έρευνα και τη διδασκαλία των γυναικείων σπουδών, το φεμινιστικό προβληματισμό στην επιστήμη και την ισότητα των φύλων στον ακαδημαϊκό χώρο.

Το Π.Μ.Σ. Φύλο και Θρησκεία έχει ως στόχο την παραγωγή της γνώσης, την ανάπτυξη της έρευνας, τη μετεκπαίδευση και εξειδίκευση στις *γυναικείες σπουδές*, την προώθηση δηλαδή της αρχής της ισότητας και στο γνωστικό πεδίο των Ιδρυμάτων Ανώτατης Εκπαίδευσης. Το Π.Μ.Σ. παρέχει τη δυνατότητα απόκτησης Μεταπτυχιακού Διπλώματος Ειδίκευσης (Μ.Δ.Ε.). Ειδικότερα μέσω του ΠΜΣ και τη συνεργασία ομάδας καθηγητών του Τμήματος Κοινωνιολογίας του Παντείου Πανεπιστημίου, το Τμήμα Θεολογίας επιδιώκει:

α) τη συστηματική ανάπτυξη και διάχυση της μελέτης του έμφυλου χαρακτήρα των κοινωνικών σχέσεων και της τεκμηρίωσης της κοινωνικής ανισότητας σε θέματα φύλου, με ιδιαίτερη αναφορά στο χώρο της θρησκείας.

β) την ανάπτυξη μιας νέας επιστημονικής προσέγγισης στα γνωστικά αντικείμενα της κοινωνιολογίας και της θεολογίας, που θα κάνει αισθητή την παρουσία των γυναικών στο κοινωνικοοικονομικό και επιστημονικό γίγνεσθαι.

γ) τη δημιουργία ενός νέου επιστημονικού δυναμικού ικανού να κατανοεί και να προωθεί την αρχή της ισότητας σε όλους τους τομείς της κοινωνίας (εκπαίδευση, διοίκηση, οικονομία, τεχνολογία κλπ.).

δ) την ευαισθητοποίηση του εκπαιδευτικού – ακαδημαϊκού δυναμικού στην ανώτατη εκπαίδευση σε θέματα ισότητας και φύλου.

ε) την ανάπτυξη για πρώτη φορά διεθνώς του γνωστικού αντικείμενου των ζητημάτων ισότητας και φύλου στο χώρο της ορθόδοξης θεολογίας.

Αντικείμενο του μονοτηματικού Προγράμματος Μεταπτυχιακών Σπουδών του Τμήματος Κοινωνικής Ανθρωπολογίας και Ιστορίας είναι η υψηλού επιπέδου εκπαίδευση επιστημόνων και ερευνητών, εξειδικευμένων στις γυναικείες σπουδές και τις μελέτες για τα φύλα, οι οποίοι (-ες) θα είναι σε θέση να ανταποκρίνονται στις ανάγκες των σημερινών πολυπολιτισμικών κοινωνιών, συμβάλλοντας στην προώθηση της αρχής της ισότητας στη βάση της ετερότητας σε όλους τους τομείς. Πρόκειται για ένα διεπιστημονικό πρόγραμμα το οποίο συνθέτει την Κοινωνική Ανθρωπολογία με την Ιστορία, και τη διαπλοκή τους με συναφείς επιστήμες, όπως η Οικονομία, η Πολιτική, η Εκπαίδευση, η Κοινωνιολογία, και η Τέχνη. Ένα επιπλέον καινοτόμο στοιχείο του προγράμματος συνιστούν οι θεωρητικές και μεθοδολογικές προσεγγίσεις που συνδυάζουν τις γνώσεις από μη δυτικές κοινωνίες και πολιτισμούς σε θέματα φύλου, με τον ανάλογο διάλογο που διεξάγεται στη χώρα μας γύρω από τα ίδια θέματα. Συνεπώς, τα στοιχεία που συνθέτουν τη φυσιογνωμία του ΠΜΣ είναι η διεπιστημονική προσέγγιση την οποία εφαρμόζει, ο εξ ορισμού διαπολιτισμικός του προσανατολισμός, καθώς και η έμφαση στις ποιοτικές κυρίως μεθόδους έρευνας και ιδιαίτερα στην εθνογραφική προσέγγιση.

Βασικοί σκοποί του προγράμματος είναι:

- Σε επιστημονικό επίπεδο, η παραγωγή και μετάδοση νέας επιστημονικής γνώσης σχετικά με το πρωτότυπο αυτό αντικείμενο, το οποίο η ελληνική πολιτεία και η Ευρωπαϊκή Ένωση έχουν αποδεδειγμένα θέσει σε υψηλή στρατηγική προτεραιότητα, καθώς και η ανάπτυξη ακαδημαϊκών και ερευνητικών συνεργασιών, σε εθνικό και διεθνές επίπεδο.

Founded in the 1980s, this MA was the first of its kind at a British University, offering a literature-based approach to Women's Studies. It has been recently redesigned in response to changing trends in the fields of Gender Studies and women's writing, to give students both a sound training in research methods and the opportunity to study texts from a variety of different literary genres across different historical periods from the Middle Ages to the Twentieth Century and beyond. The normal entry requirement is a good BA degree in English or a related subject.

This programme will appeal to students interested in gender issues in contemporary and literature but also draws on the work of historical feminist figures with a close connection to Hull, such as Mary Wollstonecraft (1759-97), the author of the first British feminist manifesto, *A Vindication of the Rights of Woman* (1792), who lived in Beverley between the ages of 9 and 15, and the early twentieth-century feminist writer Winifred Holtby (1898-1935), who immortalised Hull ("Kingsport") and her Yorkshire neighbourhood in her masterpiece *South Riding* (1936)

The Graduate Certificate Program in Women's Studies is designed for students enrolled in a graduate program in any field who wish to complement their training with an additional specialization in Women's Studies.

A certificate signifying completion of the Certificate Program requirements will be awarded in conjunction with the student's graduate degree.

Students who previously received a master's or doctoral degree also may enroll in the Graduate Certificate Program as non-degree graduate students.
